5. Financial Reports

City Manager Cesar Correa reviewed the monthly financials, noting that the General Fund revenues exceed revenues by \$1,243,831.29 as of 12/31/2025. That the Wastewater Fund revenues exceed revenues by \$1,943,607.11 as of 12/31/2025 and that the City received our 2nd distribution of Powell Funds in the amount of \$98,512.07. Nick Wicker with Strickland Hardee PLLC was present to review and present the 2024-2026 fiscal year audit. It was noted that they had an unmodified opinion and no deficiencies were noted. He then reviewed the total fiscal position of the City making a special point to note that the City is in excellent fiscal health.

Budget workshop is coming up and the City Council decided on Saturday, March 21st.

Finally, purchase orders and budget amendments were reviewed.

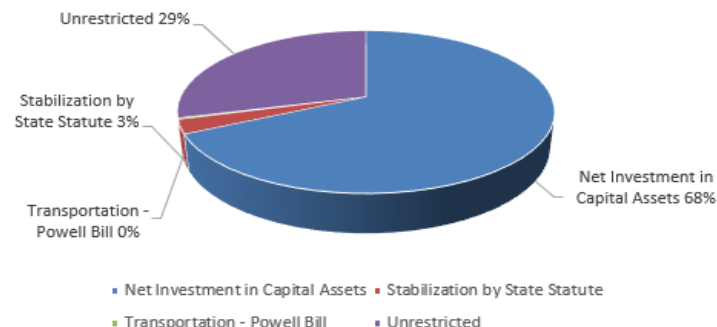

Cash Handling and Payment Acceptance Policy

Effective Date: 2/12/2026

Adopted By: City Council – 2/12/2026

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish consistent procedures for accepting payments due to the discontinuation of the one-cent coin (“penny”) in U.S. currency circulation. This policy promotes fairness, transparency, and accountability while ensuring efficient cash-handling practices for the City of Locust.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all City of Locust departments that accept payments from the public for fees, services, permits, rentals, registrations, or other charges.

3. Accepted Payment Methods

The City of Locust accepts the following forms of payment:

- Cash
 - Check
 - Credit card (Master Card and Visa subject to applicable convenience fees)
-

4. Cash Payments and Change Availability

1. The City will accept cash payments for all applicable transactions.
2. If the City has sufficient coinage available to make exact change, the transaction will be completed at the full amount due, including cents.



3. The City is not required to maintain pennies for the purpose of making change.
-

5. Application of Credits When Exact Change Is Not Available

1. When a cash payment is received and exact change cannot be provided due to the unavailability of pennies, any remaining balance owed to the customer will be applied as a credit to the customer's account.
 2. Credits will be retained on the customer's account and automatically applied to future charges or obligations with the City.
 3. Credits will not be refunded in cash unless otherwise required by law or City policy.
 4. Credits apply only to cash transactions and will not affect the stated fee or charge amount.

6. Check and Credit Card Payments

1. Transactions paid by check, credit card or other electronic payment methods will be charged the exact amount due, including cents.
 2. A convenience fee will be assessed for credit card or electronic payments in accordance with the City's adopted fee schedule and vendor agreements.
 3. No credits related to penny availability will be applied to non-cash payments.

7. Customer Choice

Customers may choose their preferred payment method. Customers who wish to avoid account credits related to cash transactions may elect to pay using a check, credit card or approved electronic payment option.

8. Transparency and Notification

The City will make reasonable efforts to inform the public of this policy through posted notices at payment locations, on the City's website, and through other appropriate communications.



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9. Compliance and Review

This policy shall be administered consistently and in a nondiscriminatory manner. The policy will be reviewed periodically and updated as necessary to reflect changes in law, payment practices, or operational needs.

PURPOSE: Site Visit / OAC

Project Status Updates:

- **HVAC & Ductwork:** Contractor has reported ductwork is approximately 90-95% complete. Main units are scheduled to be hung tomorrow. Copper refrigerant piping is scheduled to begin Wednesday and is anticipated to be completed by Monday. HVAC scope will be nearing completion thereafter, with remaining finish items (e.g., grilles) to be installed after the ceiling is in place.
- **Plumbing:** All piping and water lines have been installed. System testing is scheduled for tomorrow. Vent penetrations are also scheduled for tomorrow. Anticipated readiness for inspection by Wednesday.
- **Electrical:** Contractor is targeting completion of rough-in by mid-next week. Additional manpower is being added to maintain schedule.
- **IT and Audio/Visual:** Coordination is ongoing. AV cable pull is scheduled for the end of next week. No inspection is required for this phase.
- **Doors and Windows:** Delivery is expected by the end of this week.
- **Stucco:** Work is planned to begin before the end of the month, pending inspections.
- **Insulation:** Installation will proceed following inspections, tentatively, by the end of next week. Some buffer time is included in the schedule to accommodate potential inspection-related delays.
- **Drywall:** Installation is targeted to begin around January 28-29, following completion of insulation.

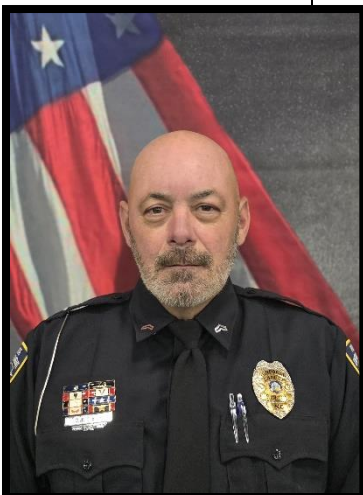
